CODE OF ETHICS & SUPERVISION

As a Registered Associate with the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists (Board), I abide by its Code of Ethics. I am supervised by Tony Lai, a Licensed Professional Counselor, a Registered Play Therapist Supervisor, and an Oregon Board Approved LPC and LMFT Supervisor.

FEE SCHEDULE

Initial consultations are free for 20 minutes, initial assessments are one-time sessions at \$150 for 90 minutes, individual sessions are \$125 for 60 minutes, and maintenance check-in sessions are \$65 for 30-minutes. Sliding scale rates are available upon request with limited spots for a duartion of 12 sessions at \$65/session.

BILL OF RIGHTS

As a client, you have the following rights as established by the Oregon State Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists (OAR833-60-001):

- To expect that a licensee has met the qualifications of training and experience required by state law;
- To examine public records maintained by the Board and to have the Board confirm the Credentials of a licensee;
- To obtain a copy of the Code of Ethics;

Certified CCPT/CPRT Supervisor

- To report complaints to the Board;
- To be informed of the cost of professional services before receiving services as defined by rule and law, with the following exceptions:
 - 1. Reporting suspected child abuse;
 - 2. Reporting imminent danger to client or others;
 - 3. Reporting information required in court proceedings or by client's insurance company or other relevant agencies;
 - 4. Providing information concerning licensee case consultation or supervision; and
 - 5. Defending claims brought by client against licensee;
- To be free from discrimination because of age, color, culture, disability, ethnicity, national origin, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, marital status, or socioeconomic status.
